

CURLING ALBERTA TO BE STRONGLY REPRESENTED AT THE MEN'S, WOMEN'S, AND MIXED DOUBLES NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

As previously announced, the cancellation of the highly anticipated flagship provincial championships in Sylvan Lake left the Curling Alberta's Board of Directors with the incredibly difficult task of determining Alberta's representatives at the upcoming national championships. After considering several options in their selection process, the Board referred to the guidance created by Curling Canada encouraging Member Associations to declare winners of the last provincial championships as their representatives. Curling Alberta is confident that they will be proudly represented by reigning provincial champions Team Laura Walker, Team

Brendan Bottcher, and Team Tran/Aaron Sluchinski.

Curling Canada also recently announced that 2019-20's Canadian Team Ranking System (CTRS) standings will determine the three wild-card entries in both the men's and women's events. Ranked sixth in CTRS points, Team Kevin Koe has secured a wild-card berth, giving Alberta a fourth team at the Curling Capital Event Series. Now that all 14 Member Associations have declared their champions, Curling Canada has released the final roster, available on their website.

have experienced the excitement of
seeing a potential return to the ice,
last minute event cancellations, and
constantly dealing with an unknown
curling landscape. Learning to just roll
with evolving directives and restrictions
has become the familiar and the constant.
With Alberta's teams declared, the road
to the hub city in Calgary has become a
reality. Teams and their fans could not be
more excited.

The 2021 Scotties Tournament of Hearts kicks off the Curling Capital Event Series on February 19th, and Team Walker is diving into preparations. "In between the strictest of restrictions, we were able to have a couple of weekends on the ice together, and a fair bit of ice time on our own. When restrictions have kept us from seeing the ice, we have upped our off-ice strength training and continued to work with Shannon, our mental skills coach. Our on-ice, in-person training weekends have been replaced by Zoom meetings and homework and we are making the best of the situation we are in," said Laura Walker. "We can't thank Curling Alberta enough for all they've done this season, working hard to have us safely curl right up to the eleventh hour and then having to make the tough decision of selecting a

team. We are truly honoured to wear the Alberta jackets at the Scotties."

Beginning March 5th, Canada's top men's teams are back on the ice for the 2021 Tim Hortons Brier, presented by AGI. "Although this is not a typical path to the Brier, it also is not a typical year, and our team is proud to be representing Alberta in Calgary," said Brendan Bottcher. "This past year has been challenging to say the least, and our team is looking forward to getting back on the ice to compete against the best at the Brier."

A Brier wouldn't be the same without Kevin Koe in the mix and his team is excited to have the opportunity to compete for another national title. "It will be a unique experience this year in the bubble, but we are thankful to have the chance to play for another Brier," said Koe.

Brittany Tran and teammate, Aaron Sluchinski, are also eagerly anticipating their return to the ice at the Home Hardware Canadian Mixed Doubles Championship. After the abrupt and disappointing end to last season, Tran was open about the difficulty of staying positive and motivated – something all of us can relate to. "Once we received confirmation that we were chosen to

play in the bubble it was mixed feelings of relief and a lot of excitement," said Tran. "We are thrilled to play at a national event with high caliber teams and build on our experience as a mixed doubles team." An elite field of 35 teams will compete to represent Canada at the 2021 World Mixed Doubles Championship. Based on the Canadian Mixed Doubles Rankings, the field will likely include a few more Alberta-based teams. Once all teams have formally confirmed their participation, the complete roster will be announced by Curling Canada.

"In challenging times such as these, sports provide a way to connect and unify our communities, so we are grateful that the curling event of the season will be hosted within Alberta's boundaries," says Steven Young, President of Curling Alberta. "Although we are unable to cheer on Alberta's best from the stands, we will one hundred percent be rooting for each of the four Alberta-based teams virtually."

Curling's Capital Event Series will be hosted at the Markin MacPhail Centre at Canada Olympic Park in Calgary. Keep your eyes on Curling Canada's website for the broadcast schedule to be released, event updates and for scoring during each event.


