U20

(Men's and Women's)

See below for competition specific details. The rules and details contained in the main body of the Competitors' Guide apply to this competition. In the event there is a perceived conflict between the Competitors' Guide and this appendix, this appendix is considered to take priority.

This appendix is subject to further review and evaluation on, at a minimum, an annual basis.

Special note for all competitors under 18 years of age: As per section 4 of the Competitors' Guide, Curling Alberta will require at least one parent/guardian of each player under 18 years of age to complete the online Safe Sport Program in order for the minor to participate in any sanctioned event. To complete Safe Sport training, parents must sign up for 'The Locker' via the Coaches Association of Canada website. Teams competing in a Curling Alberta Provincial Qualifier do so with the knowledge that they must continue to play at all levels, up to and including the Provincial Championships, until they are eliminated. In effect, this means a competitor may enter the U20 (Junior) category and another category (e.g. Mixed Doubles, U18, or Women's/Men's) as long as there is no date conflict up to and including the Provincial Championship.

The draw and schedule for the Provincial Qualifiers and Provincial Championships will be supplied to all teams and posted on the Curling Alberta Website. Reference the Competitor's Guide for details on draw making procedure and seeding if applicable.

A. PROVINCIAL QUALIFIERS:

- In advance of the Provincial Championship, three separate Provincial Qualifiers will be conducted and standard qualifying berths will be awarded as per the Curling Alberta Berth Policy.
- 2. Eight (8) provincial berths are awarded in total, per gender. Seven (7) of these berths are standard berths earned through Provincial Qualifiers.
- 3. One berth is awarded as a Provincial pre-qualifier; see Berth Policy, section 3(C). Teams must participate in the Excel Cup, if offered, in order to win the pre-qualifying berth. Note that a team who has accepted a pre-qualifying berth to the Provincial Championship is ineligible to compete in a Provincial Qualifier.
- All games are 10 ends.

- Coaches will utilize the Enhanced Coaching Involvement Pilot. (See <u>Enchanced Coaching</u> <u>Involvement Guide</u> for details).
- 6. Game timing may occur, with no penalty assessed. It is expected participants and officials will use this timing opportunity to enhance training and skill development. Pace of play may be further managed by the Chief Umpire.
- 6. There are no "free agents" in any Curling Alberta U20 competition.
- 7. Teams must have a coach. Coaches at this competition are considered a team member and must abide by all relevant policies and team expectations (see the Competitors' Guide for details).

B. PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIP:

- 1. The format is an eight (8)-team full round-robin with "top 3" playoffs.
- A Pre-event seeding shall occur using the Alberta Junior Tour Rankings Points (AJTRS). When
 AJTRS is not available for teams, teams will be given zero points. Ties in AJTRS points will be
 broken by random draw. Curling Alberta reserves the right to amend the seeding procedure
 at the discretion of the Competitions Committee should the format of the championship
 change.
- 3. All games are 10 ends and are timed.
- 4. Coaches will utilize the Enhanced Coaching Involvement Pilot. In doing so, 2 minutes of thinking time will be added, but there will be no timeouts. (See <u>Enchanced Coaching Involvement Guide</u> for details). Thinking time is 40 minutes per 10 ends; 5 minutes and 30 seconds are allowed for each extra end. The fifth end break is 5 minutes.
- 5. Each player must deliver one LSD during the round robin.
- Teams must have a coach. Coaches at this competition are considered a team member and must abide by all relevant policies and team expectations (see the Competitors' Guide for details).
- 7. PLAYOFFS:
 - i. After the round-robin, the first place team will advance to the finals.
 - ii. The second and third place teams will play in a semi-final with the winner advancing to the final (see Playoffs section 2(C)(5) in the Competitors' Guide for complete details, including the procedure in the event of a tie for a playoff position).

C. NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP:

- 1. The team in each gender that wins the Provincial Championship will represent Alberta at the 2023 U20 Canadian Championships.
- Alberta has been awarded a second berth per gender to the 2023 U20 Canadian
 Championships. Curling Alberta will award the second berth to the team highest on the
 AJTRS at the end of the Provincial Championship. This will include points awarded at the
 Provincial Championship. If the team at the top of the AJTRS at this time is also the Provincial
 Championship winner, Curling Alberta will award the second berth to the next highest
 ranked team on the AJTRS.
