'TEACHING THE TEACHERS' CURLING CLINIC

Prairie Land school division held a successful curling clinic on Thurs. Feb. 2, in Consort, working with Shannon Kleibrink and Andy Jones from Curling Alberta.

"For many, curling is one of the lifetime sports that individuals can enjoy at any age," said Divisional Numeracy Coordinator Holly Stanger.

"Both young and old can enjoy the sport of curling. It's also a really social sport. Joining a curling team or attending a local bonspiel is a great way to support a community and get to know some great people.

A lot of time and effort goes into maintaining these small rural clubs and by getting youth involved it really helps to ensure the rinks stay busy and will remain busy for many years to come."

Fifteen people participated during the event from a variety of communities including Amisk, Coronation, Cessford, Pollockville, Delia, Youngstown, Hanna and Consort. "The clinic to 'teach the teachers' was meant to help people to learn how to teach youth to better develop their skills in the sport," said Stanger.

"Everyone who attended was super enthusiastic and passionate about growing the junior programs in their respective communities."

Topics covered during the clinic included safety on the ice, correct delivery and sweeping techniques (coaching tips, as well as, common mistakes), proper release of the rock for in and out turns, gameplay strategy, games to play to engage students, and orientation of the ice surface and curling facility.

"The curling clinic is one of many of the workshops Prairie Land school division is doing in a series of coaching workshops dedicated to the variety of sports being offered in the division's schools," said Stanger.

SCOTTIES TOURNAMENT OF HEARTS RETURNS TO CALGARY IN 2024



The curling spotlight will once again shine brightly on Calgary, as the 2024 Scotties Tournament of Hearts returns to the WinSport Event Centre at Canada Olympic Park. Canada's best women's teams will be showcased as they compete for the national title February 16-25.

As capacity at WinSport is limited, fans are encouraged to purchase their tickets early, to secure their spot to cheer on Canada's curling elite vie for the title of Team Canada.

"About a year from now, the best curlers in Canada will have arrived in Calgary to rock and roll in the beautiful Winsport Arena," said event Co-Chair, Amy Nixon, "Hurry and get your tickets to make sure you can live it live!"

Beginning February 23 at 10 a.m. MST, the following ticket packages go on sale:

Full Event Package (\$408-\$444): A single ticket to every draw of the 2024 Scotties Tournament of Hearts.

Championship Weekend Package (\$198-\$228): A single ticket to every draw from Friday, Feb. 22, to Sunday, Feb. 24.

Opening Weekend Package (\$108-\$132): A single ticket to all draws from Friday, Feb. 15, to Sunday, Feb. 17.

Weekday Package (\$60-\$69): A single ticket to all three draws on either Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday.

Tickets for these initial package offerings are only available online through Ticketmaster at https://www.curling.ca/tickets/ as there is no on-site box office at WinSport prior to the event. We are more than half way through our Provincial playdowns and starting to send our champions to National events – we wish them all good luck!

I had the pleasure of working my first Arctic Winter Games in Fort McMurray, and as Chief Umpire, was able to invite Curling Alberta umpires to work the event. Thank you to Chery Minns, Andy Lessard, Larry Jensen and Karen Lavoie from Alberta, and Peggy Dorosz from Whitehorse. I have worked two Canada Winter Games and this event is very much similar as far as curling goes, but the additional sports are the exception. There are 21 events with 2,100 athletes and approximately 2,000 volunteers. We were able to watch Dene and Arctic Sports and attend the Opening and Closing Ceremonies. The Arctic Games are open to athletes North of the 55th parallel and includes Northwest Territories, Yukon, Nunavut, Alaska,

Greenland, Nunavik (Northern Quebec), northern Alberta, and the Indigenous people (Sami) of Norway, Sweden, and Finland.

We have introduced hosting a Zoom meeting with all umpires and championship coordinators one week in advance of each provincial championship. It has helped in coordinating schedules of the event and making sure all information is shared and accessible. These will continue for the remainder of the season and thank you to Britney and Michael for your set up, and umpires for attending.

Thank you to everyone for volunteering this season, some of you have been particularly busy for the Curling Alberta events and we really do appreciate your time!

CALGARY YOUTH CURLING ASSOCIATION JAM CAN BONSPIEL

The CYCA Jam Can Bonspiel has been around longer than the CYCA itself. It was originally an outdoor bonspiel with actual jam cans for rocks. There is an example of one in the Southern Alberta Curling Association Hall of Fame in the Calgary Curling Club. The CYCA took over running this bonspiel in the late 1980s and it has been a feature of our season ever since.

This year's event took place on February 4 at the Calgary Curling Club. Eighteen teams participated, representing a significant



increase in teams from last year. The bonspiel is for curlers who are under the age of 12 and is usually the first opportunity for most of these youngsters to curl outside their own club. We use the event to encourage these young up-and-coming curlers to think about joining our Sunday League and to also support recreational bonspiels for the under twelve group.

The event features both a lite rock and regular rock division with each team playing three 2-end games over two hours. In some cases, these curlers have never played in an actual game. It is a great opportunity to introduce them to game procedures and pace of play. We had a large number of volunteers to encourage the athletes to get into the hack quickly and coaches to help with strategy. I think some of the teams played faster than some of the teams in my Tuesday adult league.

Every participant receives a medal at the end of the day along with a gift from the CYCA and an opportunity to win door prizes. If you see a young curler with a red bag emblazoned with "CYCA", there's a good chance that they received it here.

It was a fun day for curlers, parents and volunteers. The Calgary Curling Club were excellent hosts and we hope to be invited back next year.

LOCAL YOUTH GETTING INTRODUCED TO THE SPORT OF CURLING

The Pidherney Centre in Red Deer is on a mission to introduce local youth to the sport of curling.

On Feb. 6, Grade 4 students at St. Elizabeth Seton School in Red Deer had the chance to learn all about it and give it a try in the school's gymnasium.

Lynne Entz, a member of the Pidherney Centre Board of Directors, says they began their initiative in January and are visiting one school at a time.

"The objective is to introduce the sport to the kids in the community and let them know that it is available and it's out there for kids to join. Any kids from the ages of nine to 18 are welcome to join the program. It's on Monday nights form about 5:00-6:30 p.m," she explains. "This season is almost finished



but we're introducing this to the kids so they can join for next September and the season goes from about October until March."

Entz says she and a group of volunteers from the Pidherney Centre bring two bags of "Floor Curl" rocks to the schools and 10 brooms from the broom room at the rink. She says since they can't take the granite ones from the rink, they take two bags of rubber rocks with three bearings on the bottom so they wheel across the gym floors.

"We're just spreading our love of the game and showing the kids that it's fun, it's something to do with friends, it's a way to come and meet new people, it's something different," says Entz. "It's important to reach out to our youth because with most sports and COVID, we lost a lot of those kids and some of them grew up and they're older than 18, so we're trying to get back out to the community and try to build our program up."

Entz says they have 14 schools signed up, with four visited so far and 10 more to go. She says it is her goal to have these floor rocks touch the hands of about 5,000 kids in the community.

"I hope they see that it's a lot of fun. I hope they see that they can join by themselves and meet new people or if they have a buddy that wants to join a smaller team, if they just want to go do something on a Monday night and hang out, go to the curling rink. Dinner is included this year," adds Entz.

She further points out that curling is one of the more affordable sports you can play.

"To join the program this year, it was about \$220 to curl from October until March," explains Entz. "We had Olymel step up and sponsor. They have sponsored the food side of things for dinner after. But we also had the Red Deer Optimist Club step up and donate money and that covered shoe rental and broom rental for the kids, so the fees were just to cover the ice."

Entz encourages anyone who hasn't curled before, to give it a try.

"You never know if you'll love it," she points out. "I started when I was a kid and I still play today. We have all ages of volunteers and it's honestly a sport that anybody can play."

Entz says interested kids can sign up on their own or bring friends to play with them. The time commitment is one night a week.

Registration for next year will start in the summer.
