The summer of 2024 experienced exceptionally high temperatures, and the 2023-2024 curling season proved to be equally vibrant.

Scotties Tournament of Hearts & Alberta Boston Pizza Cup

Highlights:

Reflecting on last year's Curling Alberta season, Team Sturmay achieved a significant milestone by winning the Sentinel Storage Alberta Scotties Tournament of Hearts held in St. Paul. This accomplished team, based at the Saville Community Curling Centre, was skipped by Selena Sturmay and included third Danielle Schmiemann, second Dezaray Hawes, lead Paige Papley, and Coach Ted Appelman.

On the men's side, Team Sluchinski triumphed in the highly competitive Alberta circuit, securing the Boston Pizza Cup in Hinton and earning a coveted spot at the Montana's Brier in Regina, Saskatchewan. This Airdrie Curling Club team was led by skip Aaron Sluchinski, with third Jeremy Harty, second Kerr Drummond, lead Dylan Webster, and Coach Mickey Pendergast rounding out the roster.

2024 Alberta Rocks Recap

Curling Alberta was actively engaged in August in Leduc, hosting two Alberta Rocks Summer Camps. Camp #1 welcomed 69 curlers in five age- and skill-based groups, while Camp #2 attracted 112 participants in six groups. Held at the Leduc Curling Club from August 10 to August 18, the camps featured eight days of intensive training.

Participants received high-quality technical and tactical instruction on the ice, complemented by classroom sessions at the Leduc Recreation Centre. Topics included strategy, team dynamics, and player roles. A highlight was a sport psychology workshop led by Erin

Registration Now Open for U-15 RockFest West In-Person Qualifying Events

We are excited to announce that registration is now open for the U-15 RockFest West in-person qualifying events! These engaging qualifiers will offer valuable development opportunities and skills competitions for youth curlers.

The U-15 RockFest West will take place at the Kelowna Curling Club from February 27 to March 1, 2025. The Growth of Stick Curling in Alberta

Stick curling is surging in Alberta, where 8% of curlers now use the stick delivery, making it the fastest-growing curling format in the province. Alberta is home to Canada's largest stick curling community, with St. Albert Curling Club hosting 13 leagues and over 250 stick curlers. The Alberta Stick Curling Association continues to expand interest through the Alberta Stick Curling Tour, sponsored this year by Olson Curling.

The 2025 Alberta Stick Curling
Championships will take place February
28–March 2 at the Grande Prairie Curling
Centre, with Men's, Women's, and Mixed
categories. Sponsored by Pomeroy
Hotels, the event is open for entries at
albertastickcurling.ca. Shortly after, the
Canadian Stick Curling Championships will
also be held in Grande Prairie from April
2–6, welcoming both provincial champions
and open entry teams to compete in Open
and Women's divisions. With 72 teams
expected, it will be one of the largest stick
curling championships to date.

This season, Curling Alberta is launching a new club championship for stick curlers, allowing each club in Alberta to send a representative, with the winner earning a spot in the Canadian Championships. The Championship will be held February 21-23, 2025, at the Didsbury Curling Club. Further details on the championship structure will be announced soon, providing clubs across Alberta a chance to participate in this provincial showcase.

Inside Curling will also host the world's largest stick bonspiel at the Saville Community Sports Centre from April 23–26, 2025. Open to all stick curlers, the bonspiel offers a substantial prize pool of \$10,000. Teams can register at kevinmartincurling.com, with a \$300 entry fee. This global-scale event is set to further elevate stick curling's profile in Alberta and beyond.

Linda Wagner from Calgary Curling Club Inducted into the Governor General's Curling Club

Linda is among ten new inductees honored for lifelong contributions to curling, recognized for her volunteerism and success on the ice. Her volunteer work began in 1980 and spanned four decades, during which she supported curling in countless ways. Linda started curling in Saskatchewan in the mid-70s before her career in Alberta. In 1974, she secured her first major win as a Saskatchewan Provincial Champion, playing third for the Emily Farnham Team, which went on to claim the national MacDonald Lassie Championship in Victoria.

Her achievements since then are remarkable, including multiple Provincial titles and six Canadian Championship appearances, where she won two gold medals and medaled in four others. In recognition of success, Linda and teammates were inducted into the Saskatoon Hall of Fame in 1993 and the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame in 2007. Beyond her competitive career, she dedicated herself to coaching juniors and promoting curling through various executive roles at Calgaryarea clubs. As a high school teacher in Saskatoon, she helped introduce curling into special physical education classes. Linda chaired the Autumn Gold Curling Bonspiel three times, an event still going strong since its inception in 1977. In 2000, she received the Ray Kingsmith Award for her volunteer contributions. Today, Linda's enduring impact on the sport is celebrated with this welldeserved honor.

MEDICINE HAT CURLING CENTRE REOPENS AFTER TWO-YEAR WAIT

The newly-renovated Medicine Hat Curling Centre — renamed RME Place after its flagship sponsor Rocky Mountain Equipment — was officially opened on Friday when longtime curler Cliff Landsiedel threw a ceremonial first rock.

"It's just a great honour to be able to do this for the club," said Landsiedel, who has been a member of the club for a quarter-century.

"I really appreciate this," the 90-year-old curler added.

The club was forced to cease operations in fall 2022 due to the poor condition of the ice caused by problems with the brine lines located under the concrete slabs.

The curling club was approved last December for a \$870,000 grant from the Alberta government through its Community Facility Enhancement Program. Between the grant, selling the building to the City of Medicine Hat and fundraising efforts, the curling club raised over \$1.7 million to get the facility running again, general manager Bryden Smith said.

It was a big effort by the community to get the club back on the ice and Friday's reopening of the curling centre brought a sigh of relief for Smith.

"It just feels like we finally crossed that finish line we've been racing towards and it's really good to see everyone back and out curling," Smith told CHAT News.

It was a throw about two years in the making that kicked off the long-awaited return of the Medicine Hat Curling Club. It wasn't long after Landsiedel slide the rock down the ice that an inaugural tournament got started with dozens of curlers filling the sheets.

Smith is looking forward to relaunching

the local curling scene with new events and by attracting the next generation of curlers. "Our goal is to try and get new curlers out. We've been in contact with the schools to get them all gym classes or to get high schools out and curling competitively," he said.

Smith also wants to create a welcoming atmosphere for those who curl to have fun. "We'd really like to expand our facility, see more curlers and bring a general positive and relaxed recreational vibe to the facility where it's not about winning or losing," he added.

"It's about having fun and making good memories."

Reopen = Rebrand

The Medicine Hat Curling Club has rebranded as the Medicine Hat Curling Centre, aiming to become a more accessible and welcoming space for the entire community. This shift comes ahead of the Centre's reopening, planned for October, following a two-year closure caused by a brine leak. New general manager Bryden Smith notes that the rebrand is meant to

move beyond the "club" label, inviting people of all backgrounds to enjoy the facility's offerings, including its renovated lounge, new quartz bar, updated lighting, and other modern touches. The Centre has also preserved its history through a dedicated section on its new website and added historical memorabilia throughout the facility.

To encourage community involvement, Smith is focused on expanding youth participation by collaborating with local schools, revitalizing the junior coaching program, and adopting new coaching technologies. The Medicine Hat Curling Centre's new ice plant and ice mats are set to be installed soon, marking the final step before it reopens. Smith emphasizes that while the aesthetic upgrades have modernized the Centre, the board remains committed to celebrating the facility's history, making it a fresh yet familiar start for members and newcomers alike.

Welcome Back, Curling Alberta **Umpires!**

Curling Alberta is delighted to welcome back all our dedicated umpire volunteers for the 2024/25 season! We have an exciting schedule ahead, featuring over twenty provincial qualifiers and twelve provincial championships. None of these events would be possible without the hard work and commitment of our volunteers who serve as timers and umpires. Your countless hours of support are deeply appreciated and never go unnoticed.

This season, we're thrilled to introduce a new event: the Provincial Stick Club Curling Championship. With the growing popularity of stick curling, we're excited to host this inaugural event in Didsbury from February 21-23, 2025.

What's New This Season:

Curling Alberta will align with Curling Canada's rule changes, allowing teams in all adult categories (excluding Masters) that advance to national championships to request only one 60-second timeout per game.

The playoff format for Curling Alberta championships (Senior Men, Master Men, U18 Men, and Women) will transition to a four-team page playoff, replacing the previous three-team format.

The Women's Championship will expand from an eight-team round robin to a twelve-team triple knockout format, with four teams advancing to a page playoff.

Curling Alberta recently held its first of two annual fall regrouping meetings for umpires on October 5th at the Calgary Curling Club, which included an on-ice training session. The second meeting is scheduled for October 19th at the Granite Curling Club in Edmonton. A special thank you to the Calgary Curling Club for their hospitality—we look forward to reuniting at the Granite Curling Club!




