## MEN'S & WOMEN'S PROVINCIAL CHAMPS RECAP

### 2026 RME ALBERTA SUMMIT OF CHAMPIONS: A STANDOUT WEEK IN OKOTOKS!

The **2026 RME Alberta Summit of Champions**, presented by Best Western Hotels & Resorts and Sentinel Storage, concluded after a strong week of competition in Okotoks, showcasing not only the province's top curling talent but also the strength of the community that made the event possible.

This year's championships relied on roughly 180 volunteers who supported every facet of the event. The group included longtime members of the Okotoks Curling Club, curlers from across Alberta, and residents who stepped in simply wanting to contribute. Ice installation at the Murray Arena began shortly after Christmas and continued right through to the final cleanup in the early hours of January 12, illustrating the level of dedication required. Their efforts, along with those of the host committee leads, helped Okotoks once again deliver a championship experience that met the high expectations curlers have come to associate with the club.

Behind the scenes, officials and umpires ensured consistent play across all draws, while the ice technicians maintained precise and dependable conditions throughout a demanding week. Their work guaranteed that athletes had the surface they needed to perform at an elite level.

Crowds were steady all week, with energy peaking whenever local teams took the ice. The community's engagement proved to be one of the event's greatest strengths. This year also marked the successful introduction of the combined men's and women's provincial championships with live spectators, an important milestone for curling in Alberta.



#### Women's Championship

Team Sturmey captured the women's provincial title with a composed and strategic 9–6 victory over Team Gray-Withers. After an earlier loss to the same opponent in the A-side bracket, Sturmey's rink responded with a poised and disciplined performance in the final, controlling key ends and closing out the game with authority. The win adds another significant achievement to Sturmey's growing résumé at the provincial level.

#### Men's Championship

On the men's side, Team Koe went undefeated throughout the week, securing the provincial crown with a 9–7 victory over Team Tao. The final remained close until a decisive three-ender in the seventh end gave Koe the edge needed to control the remainder of the game. The win marks yet another milestone in a career already defined by multiple provincial, national, and world titles.

### Exceptional Curlers Honoured with Bo Davidiuk and Marylynn Morris Awards at the 2026 RME Alberta Summit of Champions

Calgary, AB — Two significant honours were presented during the 2026 RME Alberta Summit of Champions, celebrating athletes whose leadership, sportsmanship, and dedication stood out throughout the competition. The ceremony highlighted both the historic impact and the ongoing strength of Alberta's curling community.

#### Varyk Doepker Awarded 2026 Bo Davidiuk Award

The Bo Davidiuk Award, now in its 14th year, recognizes the front-end player who best exemplifies sweeping excellence, team support, and sportsmanship, the hallmarks of the late Bo Davidiuk, a lifelong curler known for elevating everyone around him.

The 2026 recipient is Varyk Doepker of Team Hlushak, honoured for his exceptional performance and the team-first mindset he displayed throughout the Summit. The award continues a lineage of respected recipients, including Marc Kennedy (2013), Brad Thiessen (2017), James Ballance (2024), and Lucas Sawiak (2025).



#### Emma DeSchiffart Receives Inaugural Marylynn Morris Builder Award

This year's Summit also marked the introduction of the Marylynn Morris Builder Award, created to honour a female competitor who demonstrates outstanding leadership and sportsmanship - values deeply tied to the legacy of Marylynn Morris.



With a career spanning five decades, Marylynn contributed to curling as a coach, educator, and long-serving Executive Director of the Northern Alberta Curling Association. Her influence, mentorship, and passion helped shape generations of curlers across the province.

The first-ever recipient of this new award is Emma DeSchiffart, recognized for carrying forward the spirit, integrity, and leadership that defined Marylynn's life in curling.

The presentation of these two awards at the flagship championship underscored the values that continue to strengthen curling in Alberta, excellence, teamwork, and the commitment to building a supportive and vibrant curling community.

The **Ready to Rock** program is designed for students in **Grades 1–6**. The program begins in schools with a **Rocks & Rings Day**, followed by four on-ice sessions at a local curling club. Each session is one hour in length, and all equipment is provided. Ready to Rock is a safe, inclusive program that introduces students to the fundamentals of curling in a fun and supportive environment.

Curling Alberta is beyond excited to see the first Ready to Rock on-ice program come to life this fall. Students from **Thrive Edmonton Elementary School** were our first champions to complete the program. Both students and teachers were fully engaged throughout all sessions. The first two sessions were hosted at the **Jasper Place Curling Club**, with the final session held at the **Crestwood Curling Club**.

More than 50 students, teachers, and volunteers expressed their appreciation for the program, noting that it far exceeded their expectations. At the end of each session, the children showed their gratitude and newfound love for curling with big hugs and enthusiastic cheers of thanks.

There is nothing more rewarding than watching young athletes experience curling ice, rocks, brooms, and teamwork for the first time. The energy and joy displayed by the students were truly heartwarming.

We feel incredibly fortunate to have had front-row seats to the very first Ready to Rock on-ice program from start to finish, and we are excited to see this initiative continue to grow and flourish across Alberta.

Stick curling is one of the fastest-growing disciplines in the sport. This two-person game is enjoyed by many seniors and wheelchair curlers alike, offering an inclusive and accessible way to stay competitive and engaged on the ice.

The **Alberta Stick Curling Association (ASCA)** hosts the **Alberta Stick Curling Tour** each year, proudly sponsored by **Olson Curling**. The top teams from the tour earn **free entry** into the Alberta Stick Curling Championships. This season, seven clubs hosted tour events.
