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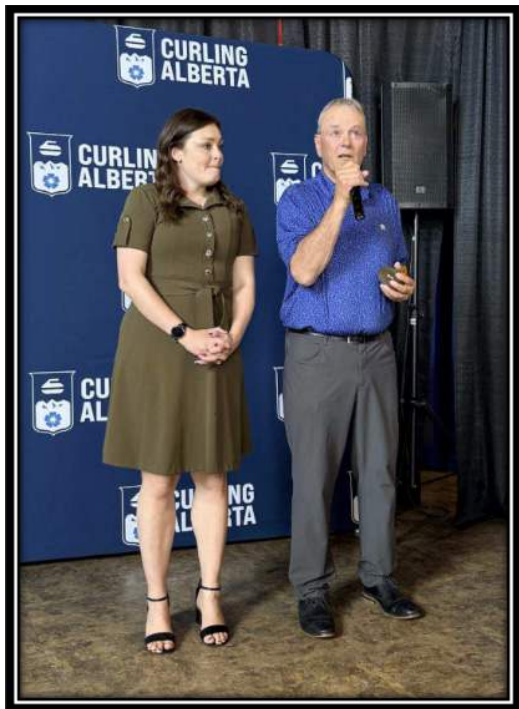

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In Sexsmith, if you want to find Amanda Sparks, just follow the sound of kids laughing on the ice. As the heart and soul of the Sexsmith Junior Curling Program, Amanda doesn't just run a program, she builds curlers, builds friendships, and builds confidence in every young person who steps onto her sheets.

This past season, Amanda coordinated and ran sessions for over 50 junior curlers across two age groups, grades 2 through 6, and grades 7 and up, with programming both before and after the holiday break. In a small community, that kind of participation is extraordinary, and it doesn't happen by accident. Amanda works hard to recruit volunteers, tailor sessions to individual skill levels, and ensure every single child feels seen and supported. She knows every kid by name. She shows up, every time.

But Amanda's impact doesn't stop when the session ends. She goes out of her way to find opportunities for kids who want more, connecting one junior to a superleague team, helping others play in their first bonspiel, and making sure every eager young curler has a path forward. She also brings the sport into local schools as part of physical education curricula and traveled to Grimshaw to run junior and adult clinics, expanding her reach far beyond her home club.

Amanda also organizes the Junior Funspiel and the U18 Cashspiel, two events that give young curlers memorable competitive experiences. When one young participant was asked what she loves most about Amanda's program, her answer was simple: "She makes curling fun." That, in a nutshell, is Amanda's superpower. She is a remarkable instructor, a tireless volunteer, and an absolute treasure to junior curling in Alberta.

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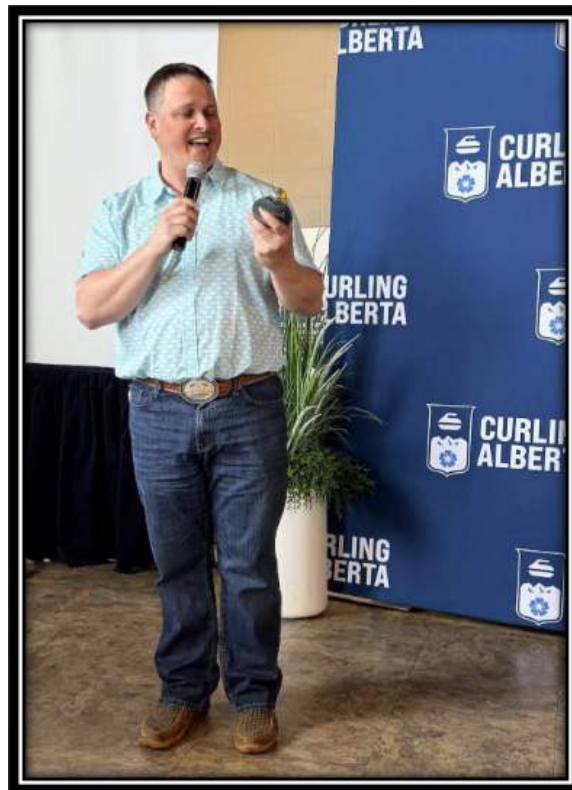

Beyond the action on the ice are the dedicated volunteers, coaches, ice techs, and leaders who keep local curling thriving.

In the 2025–2026 season, Curling Alberta partnered with over 160 affiliated clubs to build stronger, more sustainable community hubs.

Season Highlights

- **Club Support:** Connected facilities to funding, tech, and governance tools. The new Member Club News Hub saved valuable volunteer time by centralizing key resources.
- **Safe Sport:** Launched the Alberta Safe Sport Complaint Mechanism alongside updated policies to ensure safe, welcoming environments.
- **Community Outreach:** Engaged 5,000+ fans via World Women's Championship activations and filled Try Curling events to introduce new participants to the sport.
- **Skill Development:** Delivered 4 U18 camps, qualified 4 teams for U20 Nationals, certified 38 ice techs, and launched a provincial Ice Tech Team for direct club mentorship.
- **Data & Advocacy:** Improved tracking systems and surveys to better address local club needs and guide provincial planning.

Strong curling clubs are built through dedicated people and targeted support. By empowering leaders and expanding access, Curling Alberta ensures the sport remains a vibrant pillar of local communities.

Canada Day celebrations were in full swing at the **Strathcona County Canada Day Festival in Sherwood Park**, where the Curling Alberta Express Rink, proudly sponsored by Sentinel Storage, gave festival-goers a chance to experience curling in a fun and welcoming way.

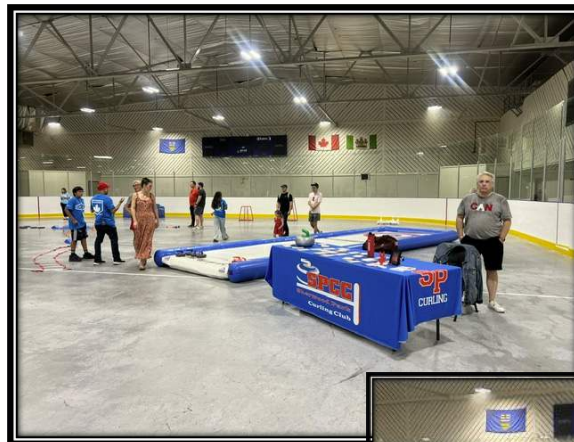
Set up by the Sherwood Park Curling Club in the Sportzone inside the Shell Arena, the Express Rink welcomed curlers of all ages from 10am to 5pm. Hundreds of people streamed through the arena over the course of the day, with a steady crowd stopping to watch, cheer, and give curling a try.

The biggest hit of the day? Our youngest curlers! Kids aged roughly 2 to 10 dominated the ice, sliding rocks with big grins and even bigger effort — with plenty of proud parents and grandparents snapping photos along the way. It was a fantastic reminder of why grassroots, come-try-it programs like the Express Rink matter: they put curling in front of families who might never otherwise set foot in a rink, and they do it in the most fun way possible.

It wasn't all smooth sailing — the building's airflow left our volunteers and participants pretty warm by the afternoon — but that didn't slow anyone down. The energy stayed high from open to close.

We also want to pass along a huge thank-you from the festival organizers, who called the day's turnout and engagement **excellent**, with strong interaction across a wide range of ages throughout the event.

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The 2025-26 season marked an exciting new chapter for Egg Farmers Rocks & Rings, presented by Curling Canada.



In the first year of an expanded partnership with Curling Alberta, the program reached more students than ever before, introducing thousands of young Albertans to the sport through fun, inclusive, and active curling experiences.

Throughout the school year, the Alberta Rocks & Rings team delivered programming in communities across the province, providing **66,377 student experiences** over **365 days** of programming. Bookings increased by more than **28%** over last season, making Alberta one of the program's fastest-growing regions. Beyond the gymnasium, more than **10,000 Alberta students** also explored curling through the Rocks & Rings online education portal with their teachers.



These results are a testament to the dedication of the Rocks & Rings instructors and the strength of the partnership between Curling Alberta and Curling Canada. Together, we're introducing more young people to curling and helping build the future of our sport across the province.

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Curling Canada is seeking qualified individuals with expertise in curling and alternative dispute resolution (ADR) to join its Fair Play Panel under the Sport Integrity Policy Suite. Panelists will provide neutral third-party mediation and arbitration services to resolve conflicts across national, provincial, and community levels, handling an anticipated two to three cases per year. Successful candidates will serve a two- or three-year term, receiving a \$2,000 annual honorarium.

Selection will prioritize candidates with a strong understanding of the Canadian sport ecosystem, the Rules of Curling, and key governance frameworks such as the Universal Code of Conduct to Prevent and Address Maltreatment in Sport (UCCMS). Professional ADR designations (such as Q.Med or C.Arb), trauma-informed training, and bilingualism are considered strong assets.

Interested applicants must submit a resume highlighting relevant dispute resolution experience alongside a detailed statement of intent addressing their curling system knowledge, recent ADR experience, and expected contributions to the panel. 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IT'S OUR HOUSE

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It all started in 1996 in Grande Prairie, Alberta. Looking to extend the fun of our local ladies league, we took our first road trip to a bonspiel in Dawson Creek, B.C. That weekend was such a blast that we decided to do it again the following year, and just never stopped.

Our criteria was simple: the bonspiel had to be far enough away to warrant a hotel room, and unless it was an emergency, we weren't allowed to call home!

The Peace Region was the perfect birthplace for our tradition. Local clubs offered tireless volunteers, excellent banquets, and uproarious good times. We'd check the bulletin board at the Grande Prairie Curling Club, divvy up tasks (entering the team, booking hotels, arranging drivers), brainstorm our themed costumes, and hit the road.

- Yukon (Whitehorse)



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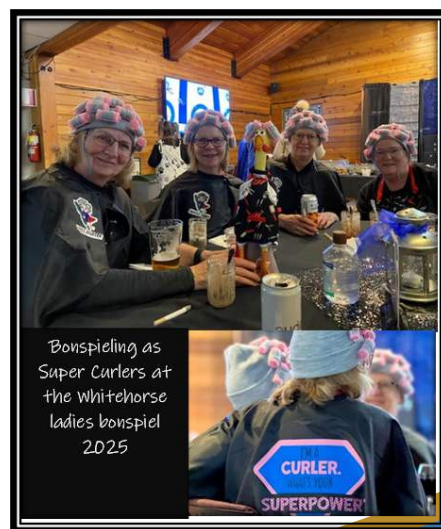
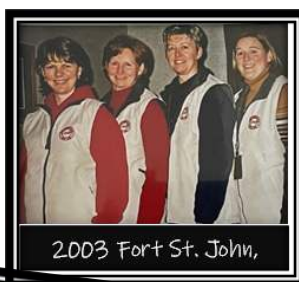
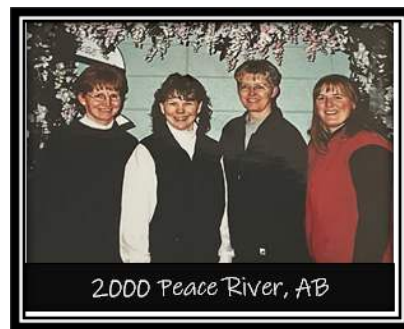
"A Road Trip is never 'only' about curling."
